The Monterey County Pops! Woodwind Quintet brought "Peter and the Wolf" to 1750 elementary school children so far this year.

"Peter and the Wolf" is a classic fairy-tale written by Prokofief for his children and set to his own unforgettable music. The kids heard Peter and his friends the Bird, the Cat, the Duck, and grumpy Old Grandfather as they outwit the villainous Wolf.

The members of the Monterey County Pops! Wind Ensemble also demonstrated their respective instruments (flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon, French horn, and timpani/percussion), held a Name-That-Tune contest with the students, performed some well-known American Folk Songs by Stephen Foster and/or Richard Rogers "Sound of Music" and answered students' questions at the end of the performance.

The virtual version of the program, complete with narration, was performed at over 35 public/private elementary schools in Monterey County in the past two years.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS...

Music filled the air when Music Director Dr. Carl Christensen brought the Monterey County Pops! Residency Program to Soledad for a full day of listening, learning, and performing. This residency included programming for every grade level, culminating with a spectacular concert featuring the Monterey County Pops! Chamber Orchestra of 22 professional musicians – with additional performances by the beginning Soledad High School Band, the 26-member advanced band, and the newly formed 21-member Mariachi --all under the leadership and baton of Edward Maag.

The Residency began in the morning for the young students at Ledesma and Franscioni Elementary School with *Peter and the Wolf.*

Throughout the afternoon, several of the Pops! musicians conducted 2-hour workshops in small group sessions with the high school band and Mariachi students. The residency ended with a spectacular evening concert for the whole community --- showcasing the Monterey County Pops! Chamber Orchestra, both Soledad High School bands, and the Mariachi. The concert concluded with a thunderous performance by the combined bands of the glorious OVERTURE 1812 – FINALE by Tchaikovsky.



"It's wonderful to see this musical diversity in our schools," says Monterey County Pops! Director Dr. Carl Christensen. "We are very pleased to make this connection with the Soledad High music program, and we are excited to make this an annual collaboration."

Monterey County Pops! Board President Steve DeCarli was also on hand to help with the preconcert preparation – including a great meal for everyone. "The 150 plus audience members enjoyed and appreciated the evening and they stayed until the last song — even after their own kids were done performing!" he was thrilled to report. "Soledad gave us one of the warmest receptions we've ever received. We were also thrilled to have the Soledad Rotary and their affiliated teen Rotaract Club supporting us as volunteers. Their efforts and service in the community are invaluable and so appreciated by all the families and community programs like ours".
