"I had to take a day and really reflect on how important the Pops outreach concert was to my student population and the community at large. Yesterday I took the day to debrief with my students about their participation in the concert by writing a reflection. I asked students to write one thing they learned and one thing they liked or enjoyed about the concert.



For me I learned that music has the power to inspire, and change lives no matter what style or genre. Even though my students didn't necessarily voice that in their reflections I could see the difference, and the change of perspective. With the expertise of the Pops my students now know the possibilities of their instrument. They gained a valuable perspective that is not seen or accessible in Greenfield.

My mission has always been to use the high school as a place for the community to celebrate their students and their culture. The Pops does such a great job of programming music that's relatable to the community. I was very happy to see audience members singing along with De Colores. It was then that I realized we did what we intended to do.
