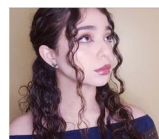
MONTEREY COUNTY POPS! presents

FREE CONCERT – Sunday, Sept. 4, 2022, 2:00 p.m.,
Closter Park, Salinas

Monterey County Pops! has announced an important addition to the Monterey County Pops! series of annual performances at major civic events in the county: a free public concert “Honoring Labor” to be presented in Salinas’ Closter Park.



This year the performance is funded by The Recording Industry's Music Performance Trust Fund administered through the American Federation of Musicians.

The 22-piece, fully professional orchestra, will be seated in Closter Park’s Kiosk or band stand which was donated several years ago by Central Coast Rotary Clubs. Cities around the world present free, outdoor concerts in similar band stands and Monterey County Pops! is proud to bring this tradition to Salinas. Community, civic, and Rotary leaders will address the audience.



The performance will begin with the National Anthem sung by recent Hartnell graduate and current San José State scholarship student, Tatiana Magdaleno. The program will feature a wide variety of musical selections chosen to appeal to all ages.

Patriotic titles include “National Emblem March,” “The Star-Spangled Banner,” and John Philip Sousa’s “Stars and Stripes Forever March.” Traditional musical selections include “Tailgate Ramble,” “Jarabe Tapatio,” La Marcha Zacatecas,” “Jesucita en Chihuahua,” “El Son de la Negra,” and “La Virgen de la Macarena.”

“Remember Me” from “Coco” and “We Don’t Talk About Bruno” from “Encanto” will appeal to children of all ages. Additional popular selections include “La Bamba” and Queen’s “Bohemian Rhapsody.” Classical music titles will be represented by the finale of the “William Tell Overture” (The Lone Ranger theme) and “Sobre las Olas,” a waltz by nineteenth century Mexican composer Juventino Rosas.

The very informal afternoon of music will be hosted in English and Spanish by Music Director, Dr. Carl Christensen. The public is cordially invited to bring blankets or lawn chairs to enjoy the 80-minute concert.

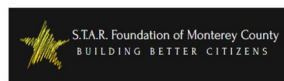
